CiCe5

The current phase of CiCe (CiCe4) will come to an end in September 2011. We intend to apply for continued funding through the Commission's Life Long Learning Programme for a further three years of funding from October 2011- 2014. The Executive Committee, following discussions with National Coordinators and suggestions from other CiCe members, have been working on the bid. Basically we keep the same organisational structure with an Executive Committee (members elected through the CiCe Association), Working Groups (some groups may not require such regular face-to-face meetings, which will enable more people to actively participate), and national and Institutional Coordinators. As now, we will hold an Annual Conference, and an Autumn Working group seminar meeting. We intend to address the following themes through working group activity:

Theme 1: Resources for understanding, teaching and learning

Continue to develop our on-line resource library including a range of re-usable learning objects and develop a multi-lingual glossary of terms for citizenship education.

Theme 2: Developing Research Capacity

Develop a training programme for PhD students with expert supervisory support that will build on our successful student conference programme.

Theme 3: Developing Intergenerational Solidarity

We will produce professional guidelines and report on innovative practice with respect to this European priority.

Theme 4: Education for Citizenship, Identity and a Sustainable Economy

We will develop interactive teaching resources on individual and social responsibilities, each year having a different focus.

Theme 5: European Identity in a Global Context

Curriculum survey related to national/ global identities with particular focus developing the work we have started in CiCe4 on peace education.

Theme 6: Schools and Society

Multi-media resources to develop multi-agency collaboration skills: this theme will also address the European agenda of New Skills for New Jobs in relation to formal education.

Theme 7: Emerging Issues in Citizenship and Identities

This will give us flexibility, allowing issues raised by members to be addressed through Network activity. The idea is to produce academic readers for, or collected papers on, selected aspects of citizenship and identities education.

What will happen next?

An outline proposal will be completed in November and circulated to you. In order to prepare the **full proposal** we will be asking each institution for:

- Contact details, addresses, etc
- A formal letter of Intent from your Rector
- Short CVs from all those interested
- Details of time to be committed, salaries, etc
- Details on your University's strengths and your commitment to the network

Please make sure that you are ready to do this!

Final proposals

This will be ready early in 2011: it will be sent electronically to you for final confirmation. We will need all details and letters of commitment at this time

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| February 2011 | We will submit the full proposal to the Commission |
| July 2011 | We anticipate hearing if we have been successful |
| October 2011 | If successful, the new Network activities commence |
