They will also work closely with other development Working Groups giving advice on how best to present interactive on-line resources.</p> <p>Pack 1 theme: democratic participation; social cohesion</p> <p>Pack 2: themes will be decided by the group in consultation with partners and informed by the curriculum survey.</p> <p>Each pack will contain a variety of resources for teaching and learning (e.g. papers, slides, podcasts, guides, session plans etc) that can be flexibly used in a range of teaching and learning contexts. These will add to an On-Line Library of teaching materials, for use in University course preparing teachers, social pedagogues, early childhood workers, etc. These will be available to be downloaded from a web location, in English and a variety of other languages.</p>
